NMSZ Projects	<p>Tim handed out status maps for the quad sheet data development project. Transmission lines will be added. MU received a CAP grant to create quad sheets for 5 more counties.</p> <p>Work is progressing on the Structures data collection. SEMO has just started the project. Homeland Security Grant	<p>Discussion about St. Louis area GIS. TEW = Terrorist Early Warning Unit is similar to MIAC at the State. Could see about getting GIS into TEW. Washington University is interested in helping with this, and could possibly be a data repository.</p> <p>GIS staff in Region F is starting a data collaboration project. They have met with Nathan, and would like to start with road centerlines and point addresses. The data would be shared with SEMA for emergency response use.</p> <p>Discussion will begin in July for September allocations.</p> <p>4 RHSOCs have put in proposals for GIS. The final copies are at SEMA now.</p>	
ER Workshop	Workshop was held on May 5 th at Washington University in St. Louis. There was a good mix of technical people and responders. Some people that signed up did not show, mostly academic folks. Mark is going to put together a survey to follow up on the workshop.	Mark will put a survey together and send it to all attendees.
Misc.	<p>DHSS – Have been working on daily maps for swine flu. Creating state maps show suspected, confirmed and probable cases. There is a time delay because of testing at CDC. Starting to slow down.</p> <p>SEMA – Severe storms in southern MO and northern MO. Used Flex viewer for first time. Feedback was really good. Virginia GIS staff assisted with tornado event.</p>	

	<p>Flex viewer – VIPER: Virginia Interoperability Picture for Emergency Response. Have developed custom tools, are willing to share with us. Louisiana National Guard has also developed custom tools also and would share them with us.</p> <p>IST – Incident Support Teams: Tim talked with Randy Cole about this. Debbie is meeting with Scott Olsen about this also. Each team will have GIS position. More will follow.</p>	<p>Renee has a conference call with Louisiana about their tools and will report back at the next meeting.</p>
